

Challenges

- Developing and sustaining partnership with ARMC (Cone Health)
- Diversion Center Logistics and Sustainability
- Maintaining stable social work position in detention center
- Data Collection
 - Tracking recidivism in detention
 - Tracking program effectiveness
- Lack of Medicaid Expansion which would provide financial support for an expansive array of treatment services for both mental Illness and substance disorders that include appropriate residential options
